

## The Pioneers of Inclusion Scholarship Application

On February 11, 1944, Father Claude Heithaus, S.J., delivered a decisive sermon about racial prejudice in America. This Mass would lead to Saint Louis University (SLU) admitting and enrolling its first five African American students into the University's 1944 summer session. SLU became the first university in a former slave state to establish an official policy to admit African Americans. This historic decision came 10 years before the Supreme Court's landmark ruling in *Brown v. Board of Education* (Topeka, Kansas), which rendered racial segregation in education illegal.

The Pioneers of Inclusion Scholarship Endowment (POISE) was established in 2014 by SLU's Black Alumni Association, 70 years after SLU's historic decision to celebrate the legacy of those five students who pioneered desegregation at SLU, and it supports current students who represent this legacy of courage for inclusion. As in 1944, SLU is furthering its commitment to social justice by neutralizing the effects of racial segregation through its mission. POISE supports SLU in living its mission by providing scholarships to increase SLU's affordability for students with financial need who will live this legacy and pioneer more inclusion for others. Ideally, the successful applicant is a student with financial need who is high achieving, first generation, and from a historically underrepresented population in U.S. higher education.

### Eligibility Criteria:

1. Students who are from a historically underrepresented population in U.S. higher education
2. Students who are first generation and/or low to modest-income as defined by the Federal TRiO Program and have financial need
3. Students with a minimum GPA of 3.0
4. Undergraduate students, with preference given to those focusing their study in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts or Math)
5. Students in good academic and disciplinary standing
6. Students returning to SLU for the spring semester
7. Submit current year FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

**Please note:** The application deadline for the Pioneers of Inclusion Scholarship is **SEPTEMBER 30<sup>th</sup>**.
